## 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Inhalation: Move to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is

### 5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

# 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

For the Part A plus Part B adhesive mixture, follow curing schedule as recommended in product literature.
